

**AUGUST 24, 2006**

The Harriman City council met in special call session Tuesday August 24th, 2006 at 5:30 p.m. in the Conference Room of the Temperance Building. The Honorable Lonnie Wright Vice-Mayor was present and presiding. Vice- Mayor called meeting to order. Roll call of Council was as follows:

**Increase in paving funds for Morgan Street and West Hills Drive-** Dr. Charles Kerley, Treasurer, informed council that the cost of paving on Morgan Street and West Hills Drive will cost almost \$32000.00 more than originally thought since receiving notice from the state. This will be an over all increase of \$157,000.00. Dr. Kerley stated that eighty percent would be covered by STP funds. Councilmember Mason asked why the increase and Dr. Kerley stated it was probably due to increase of materials. The motion was made by Councilmember Morris to approve of the increase and was seconded by Councilmember Sampson. The motion passed with a unanimous "Aye".

**First Reading of Ordinance 06-08-02-** Dr. Kerley read the Ordinance for the appropriation of funds and establishing a tax rate for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2006 and ending June 30, 2007. He stated that all departments were getting a three percent raise with the exception of the street department, which would be getting a five percent raise. He also stated that council could take funds from the money for the ball fields and use for the increase in funds for the paving project. Other notations were a reduction in the overtime for the police department and an increase in fuel money. Councilmember Mason asked council to consider donating approximately \$10,000.00 for the Harriman High School Baseball Team for a new building. Vice-Mayor Wright asked Councilmember Mason to get an estimate for the first council meeting in September. The motion was made by Councilmember Tedder for passing the ordinance and was seconded by Councilmember Sampson. The motion passed with a unanimous "Aye"

There being no further business meeting adjourned.
