

OCTOBER 10, 2006

The Harriman City council met in regular session Tuesday October 10th, 2006 at 7:30 p.m. in the Conference Room of the Harriman Municipal/Utility Building. The Honorable Jerry Davis Mayor was present and presiding. Mayor called meeting to order. Roll call of Council was as follows:

Mayor Davis asked for a motion to approve the minutes from 10/3. Councilmember Gallaher made the motion and was seconded by Councilmember Tedder. The motion passed with a unanimous "Aye".

Mayor Davis asked for a motion to pay the bills. Councilmember Mason made the motion and was seconded by Councilmember Morris. The motion passed with a unanimous "Aye".

Mayor Davis called to hear delegations.

Ms. Dunn with Keep Roane Beautiful approached council concerning a sorority that wants to adopt the Riverfront Park for two years by planting flowers and plants and keeping them up. She stated that they would officially begin on October 16th at 10:30am when the Vietnam Memorial would be recognized.

Mr. King, also with Keep Roane Beautiful, approached council with pictures of 213 Barnett Circle and 323 King Drive. He stated that both houses are in disrepair and wants to know if the city could help tear down the houses. Mayor Davis stated that he would check with the city attorney and find out.

OLD BUSINESS

Website-Councilmember Sampson asked the Mayor what the status was on getting a committee for the web site. Mayor Davis stated that he wanted Charles Kerley to take care of setting up the website and he suggested getting input from the department heads on what they want on the website.

Retreat-Councilmember Sampson stated that he would like to have the retreat as soon as possible. Mayor Davis suggested Councilmember Sampson to go ahead and chose a couple different dates and for Councilmember Tedder to go ahead and reserve the rooms needed at Roane State Community College. Mayor Davis also stated that Warren Nevad from MTAS should be asked to be a moderator at this retreat.



Fallen Officers Memorial- Mayor Davis council if they had made a decision on a donation for the Fallen Officers Memorial. Councilmember Morris made the motion to donate five thousand now and five more thousand at a later date. The motion passed with a unanimous "Aye". Mr. Rittenhouse stated that completion date would be next fall.

Van for Prisoners -Mayor Davis stated that he is having Bob Tidwell, City Coordinator to check on used vans at the state surplus for the possible purchase of one for the street department to be used for transporting prisoners for work and other uses by the city. Mayor Davis stated that he would get with the sheriff, Drack Langley and Maria Nelson on what needed to be done to get the city cleaned up with help from the county prisoners. Councilmember Morris stated that he would check the legality on what could be worked on by the prisoners. Councilmember Morris also stated that the mayor would have to sign an agreement, furnish lunch for the prisoners and basically follow the rules. He also stated that any employee that would be supervising the prisoners would have to

take a forty hours of training. The motion was made to purchase a van by Councilmember Wright and seconded by Councilmember Gallaher. The motion passed with a unanimous "Aye".
