

## NOVEMBER 14, 2006

The Harriman City council met in regular session Tuesday November 14th, 2006 at 7:30 p.m. in the Conference Room of the Harriman Municipal/Utility Building. The Honorable Jerry Davis Mayor was present and presiding. Mayor called meeting to order. Roll call of Council was as follows:

Mayor Davis asked for a motion to approve the minutes from 11/7 Councilmember Wright made the motion and was seconded by Councilmember Gallaher. The motion passed with a unanimous "Aye".

Mayor Davis asked for a motion to pay the bills. Councilmember Tedder made the motion and was seconded by Councilmember Sampson. The motion passed with a unanimous "Aye".

Mayor Davis called to hear delegations. No one approached council.

### **OLD BUSINESS**

**Retreat**-Councilmember Sampson asked council if they thought the retreat should be canceled and rescheduled until the first of next year since at least three of the councilmembers stated that they would not be attending. Councilmember Wright stated that he wanted the department heads to go ahead and submit their information for their needs and problems. Mayor Davis suggested having the retreat in mid January or the first of February.

**Cameras**-Councilmember Sampson stated that he had reports of some property being broken into close to the Riverfront Park. He stated that he thought we still need the cameras. Councilmember Sampson also stated that one of the houses broken into was an eyesore that needed to be torn down. Mayor Davis stated that he would have Maria Nelson, Building Inspector start the process.

### **AGENDA**

**2nd READING ORDINANCE 06-11-01** Mayor Davis read the ordinance amending the Harriman zoning map by rezoning certain property from R-1 low density residential district to C-2 general commercial district. The property is being sold from Mr. Gerald Largen to Mr. Patel for building a new motel. Councilmember Gallaher seconded by Councilmember Morris made the motion. The motion passed with a unanimous "Aye."

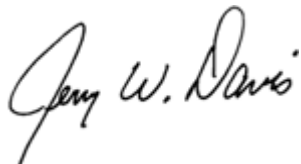
**Police Car Bids** –Mayor Davis stated that the bid from Ted Russell Ford was approximately five hundred dollars cheaper than the one from Jerry Duncan Ford for the three police cars. Mayor Davis stated that he and Charles Kerley, Treasurer would go over the bids to make sure that they both had the same specifications and go with the low bidder if that was the situation. Mayor Davis stated that if the specifications were not the same to come back to council for their decision. The motion was made by Councilmember Morris and seconded by Councilmember Sampson. The vote passed with a unanimous “Aye”.

Mayor Davis asked council to waive the agenda rule to bring up two more items. The motion was made by Councilmember Morris and seconded by Councilmember Sampson. The motion passed with a unanimous “Aye”.

**Brush Dump**-Mayor Davis stated that Drack Langley; Street Supervisor had made a request to have someone clean up the brush dump because there was no more room. The motion was made by Councilmember Morris and seconded by Councilmember Wright. The motion passed with a unanimous “Aye”.

**Inter-Local County Agreement**-Mayor Davis stated that Sheriff Stockton had approached him regarding putting in place an undercover law enforcement agreement that would benefit the City and authorize the mayor to sign documents. Councilmember Morris and seconded by Councilmember Wright. The motion passed with a unanimous “Aye”.
